## Information needed to obtain a Repair or Alteration Temporary Importation Approval Letter from EPA

The vehicle is imported solely for repair or alteration. Anyone may temporarily import a nonconforming vehicle for Repair or Alteration in accordance with 40 CFR 85.1511 (b)(1). A vehicle is imported only for repair or alteration and must comply with the following:

- Repair/Alteration exemptions may not be used for the purposes of converting vehicles to meet Federal emission requirements, or for storing vehicles (e.g., temporary storage pending conversion or exportation);
- Importer must post a bond with U.S. Customs.
- Vehicle may not be sold or otherwise transferred to another party in the U.S.; and
- Vehicle must be exported after the repair or alteration, or upon expiration of the exemption, whichever comes first.
- It may not be operated on public roads or highways in the U.S.

To obtain a Repair/Alteration Temporary Importation Approval Letter from EPA, please provide the following information:

Your exemption application needs to be in letter form and signed by the requestor.

- 1. Your full name, current address, phone number, Fax number, and email address (if applicable).
- Vehicle year, make, model and Vehicle Identification Number (for a motor vehicle engine you will need to list the year, make, model and engine serial number).
- 3. Proof of vehicle ownership (copy of current title or registration from country of origin of the vehicle).
- 4. Reason why the vehicle/engine needs to be imported to the U.S. for repairs or alterations.
- 5. Duration of the importation.
- Repair or alteration information: (What will be done to the vehicle/engine, who will be doing the repairs and contact info for the repair or alterations, any other information regarding the modifications such as a repair contract (Name and Address of the facility that is doing the Repair or Alteration (On Company Letter Head)).
- 7. A statement showing the importer and owner has read and will comply with 40CFR 85.1511(b)(1). A compliance Memorandum will be supplied once we have all of your information. The exemption will not go into affect until we receive a signed copy of the memorandum and an exemption letter is issued.
- 8. Disposition of the vehicle/engine at the end of the exemption.

• You must also include the current location of the vehicle(s)/engine(s) at the time of the exemption request.
